# <u>CAC Releases Administrative Provisions for Block</u> <u>Chain Information Services</u>

The National Intellectual Property Administration issued the Guideline about the Handling of Nonstandard Patent Labeling. The document has two parts; text, and law enforcement papers and forms. #### MOHURD Clarifies Matters Concerning Foreign-invested Enterprises' Applications for the Survey Qualification for Construction Projects

The General Office of the Ministry of Housing and Urban-rural Development ("MOHURD") has recently issued the Circular on Matters Concerning Applications of Foreign-invested Enterprises for the Survey Qualification for Construction Projects (the "Circular"). The Special Administrative Measures for Foreign Investment Access (Negative List) (2018 Edition) show that survey business for construction projects does not fall into the scope of sectors in which foreign investment to domestic and foreign investment, apply the same approval criteria and requirements to applications they receive from foreign-invested enterprises for the survey qualification for construction projects, as those applicable to applications filed by domestic enterprises, from the date this Circular is released.

#### 26-30 January, Shanghai



The Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference, second meeting of the 13<sup>th</sup> session of the Shanghai Committee, was held during 26-30 January. #### 17 January, Shanghai

#### Judgements in Civil and Commercial Matters

On January 18, 2019, the Supreme People's Court ("SPC") and the Department of Justice ("DOJ") of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region ("HKSAR") signed the Arrangement on Reciprocal Recognition and Enforcement of Judgments in Civil and Commercial Matters between the Courts of the Mainland and of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (the "Arrangement"). It provides for the scope regarding the reciprocal recognition and enforcement of judgements in civil and commercial matters between the mainland and the HKSAR, contents of judgements, procedures and ways to apply for the reciprocal recognition and enforcement, examination of jurisdiction of courts handling the original trials, circumstances where the claimed reciprocal recognition and enforcement will be declined, and approaches to seek remedy. Judgements not involving monetary payments, and those rendered for some intellectual property lawsuits also fall into the scope of said reciprocal recognition and enforcement.

### Five Departments Pledge Further Convenience to Enterprise Deregistration

Recently, five departments, including the State Administration for Market Regulation ("SAMR"), have jointly issued the Circular on Advancing the Work on Providing Convenience for Enterprise Deregistration (the "Circular"). The Circular states that all relevant departments shall achieve objectives set for shortening the list of required documents and optimizing business processes. By March 1, 2019, efficiency in the enterprise deregistration process shall be enhanced. By September 1, 2019, all regions are required to realize their goals in respect of the establishment of a specific online service module for enterprise deregistration, making it possible to deregister an enterprise on one network.

# <u>State Council's Customs Tariff Commission Publishes</u> <u>the 2019 Tariff Schedule for Imports and Exports</u>

The Customs Tariff Commission of the State Council has recently issued the Tariff Schedule of the People's Republic of China for Imports and Exports (2019) (the "Tariff Schedule") which has entered into force from January 1, 2019. It includes three parts: the "Instructions", the "Tariff Schedule for Imports," and the "Tariff Schedule for Exports." The "Instructions" mainly specify and explain the respective applicable scope of various tariff rates, country codes, units of measurement, etc. The "Tariff Schedule for Imports" covers a broad spectrum of 8,549 tariff items, while the Tariff Schedule for Exports covers 102 ones.
