Legal Updates

GAC Adjusts Regulatory Requirements for Some Imported and Exported Products Read More

The General Administration of Customs released on August 31, 2020 the Announcement about Adjusting Regulatory Requirements for Some Imported and Exported Products, effective from August 28, 2020.

The document scrapped self-testing requirements for exporters of meat and aquatic products. It said that cosmetics importers should issue a statement that they have obtained a health certificate for imported cosmetics, and they don't have to provide approval documents. The regulatory requirements that cosmetics exporters previous had to pass have now been scrapped.

SAFE Updates Business Guidelines for Foreign Exchange Under Current Account Read More

The State Administration of Foreign Exchange released on August 31, 2020 the Business Guidelines for Foreign Exchange Under Current Account (2020 Version), effective from August 28, 2020.

The guidelines consolidated existing laws and regulations, streamlined some business procedures and business documents, and revoked 29 laws and regulations. The document is divided into such chapters as foreign exchange on cargo trade, foreign exchange on service trade, foreign exchange on personal current accounts, foreign currency banknotes and payment institutions' foreign exchange business. The guidelines do not involve substantive or substantial changes to existing policies.

Two Ministries Revise Catalogue of Technologies Prohibited or Restricted by China from Export Read More

The Ministry of Commerce and the Ministry of Science and Technology released on August 28, 2020 the Catalogue of Technologies Prohibited or Restricted by China from Export.

On August 27, 2020, the Shanghai CPPCC Committee on Friendship with Foreign Countries and the Social and Legal Affairs Committee jointly held a symposium, inviting some members of the CPPCC to participate in legislative negotiations, on the key project of the CPPCC's legislative negotiation this year, the "Shanghai Foreign Investment Regulations (Draft)". The document revised five categories of technologies that are not allowed to be exported. Specifically, control points of space data transmission technology are revised into "satellite data encryption technology involving one of the following: 1. encryption principles, plans and roadmap design technology; 2. software and hardware related to encryption and decryption".

In the part regarding technologies that are restricted for export, there are 17 revisions. Pharmaceutical production technologies for chemical compounds and semi-compounds, natural medicines, and functional high polymer materials with biological activity are removed from the categories with export restrictions. Especially for TikTok, which has recently dominated its market, due to the impact of this adjustment of the catalogue, the algorithm that is regarded as the core competence is likely to be restricted from export.

MOFCOM Revises Work Rules for Handling Complaints from Foreignfunded Enterprises Read More

The Ministry of Commerce revised and released on August 31, 2020 the "Work Rules for Handling Complaints from Foreign-funded Enterprises", to be implemented from October 1, 2020.

The work rules stated that foreign-funded companies and foreign investors can file a complaint with a relevant department if they believe their legitimate interests are damaged by administrative actions or the investment environment is deteriorating. The work rules said a complaint will not affect the complainant's right to file an application of administrative review or an administrative lawsuit. As far as we know, the general foreign-invested complaint institution is the local foreign-invested enterprise association.

SAMR to Streamline Product Certification Procedures and Facilitate Domestic Sales of Goods Originally Produced for Export Read More

The State Administration for Market Regulation released on September 8, 2020 the "Announcement about Carrying Forward the Implementation Opinions of the General Office of the State Council on Supporting Domestic Sales of Goods Originally Produced for Export".

According to the announcement, before the end of 2020, enterprises are allowed to make a self-declaration that their products meet China's compulsory national standards and then sell products in the domestic market. Enterprises can make such a statement on public service platforms, on its product manual or product certificate. Local market regulators should open a green channel to approve these companies' application for domestic sale of their products that are originally planned to be exported, and optimize approval procedures for industrial production licenses and production permits for special equipment.

<u>China Extends Tariff Exclusions for Some US Imports by One Year Read More</u>

The Customs Tariff Commission of the State Council released on September 15, 2020 the Announcement about the List of First Tariff Exclusions for US Imports. According to the announcement, the period of tariff exclusions on 16 products imported from the United States will be extended by one year from September 17, 2020 until September 16, 2021.


